NEW ACTIVITY FOR 2025

A new five-week course, **Astronomy for Beginners**, is scheduled to begin on
Monday, 28th April, 1.30 to 3.30 pm at the
Strathalbyn Neighbourhood Centre.

As the name implies, the course is aimed at people with little or no knowledge of astronomy.

Topics covered include:

- * How astronomy and astrology were developed in the ancient world.
- * How religion and astronomy became friends, rivals and friends again.
- * The scientists who made the big discoveries who, how, what and when.
- * The moon, the planets and the stars how they were formed and how they work.

The course is presented as an audio-visual discussion group and includes over 300 colour projections.

As a minimum number is required to ensure viability, expressions of interest are being sought.

MEMBER PROFILE, JAN STACEY

Jan has been involved with the U3A **Genealogy Group** since 2017 and is currently the group leader, a role she has undertaken for five years.

Born in North Adelaide, Jan spent her formative years in Mt Barker. Her TAFE studies in office management later took her to various government departments beginning with the Commonwealth Police and more recently, into the fields of school



administration and finance at both Strathalbyn and Langhorne Creek.

Besides developing a passion for family history, Jan has enjoyed a number of other hobbies and community pursuits including music (she plays the flute, piano and organ) tennis & growing dahlias. She was also active in her family's cereal and dairy farm which later branched into an artificial breeding business. Jan has now lived in the district for more than fifty-five years.

Jan says that her interest in family history stems from staying with her maternal grandmother during the school holidays, but states that she started researching in earnest in the 1970s, to corroborate the stories and events shared by others.

To pursue what could now be regarded as a life-long interest in genealogy, Jan has "special memories of negotiating potholes and driving on the unsealed Long Valley, Meechi and Wellington roads" in order to get herself to Edmund Wright House to transcribe the various archived records; her knowledge of shorthand no doubt aided this endeavour.

There were highlights to be had in Jan's long journey into genealogy including many enlightening and often poignant local discoveries, and visits to Cambridge in England; Atatürk's Mausoleum in Ankara, Türkiye, and various Commonwealth War Graves Commission cemeteries in France. Together with her husband David, she has also been involved in other noteworthy projects which have included a local school, cemeteries and churches trail for U3A. She has also been proactive in The War Graves Photographic Project (TWGPP).

Jan says that 'being part of a genealogy group has been a significant U3A activity", and that she is looking forward to welcoming new members to the group during 2025.
